

How I Began Boating

Thanks to Dad Buying An Old Marina by Tom B.

When I was 14 (1962), my dad bought a run-down marina on the Allegheny River in Pittsburgh.

For helping with work in the boat yard my younger brother and I received a dilapidated 16-foot Lyman lapstrake with a sometimes-functional Johnson 40 hp. We ran it around the marina and fixed it up enough to sell it and buy a more dilapidated 1929,17-foot wooden Cris Craft runabout with a Chrysler inboard. It took a good year of work, but we made it one of the most eye-catching boats on the river...But not fast enough to readily ski. Easy enough though to sell for an 18-foot Century Resorter with a V-8 that could easily tow 3 water skiers.

College came and boats left my life until after residency when I started boating again with a 16-foot Hobie Cat sailing directly off the North Carolina beach.

Since then, I have had 3 Hobie Cats, a Flying Scott, 2 Catalina 30+ foot



sloops, and somewhere around 10 different power boats. My daughters, wife and grandsons all have their boating certificates, and I have held a captain's license for 8 years-all thanks to helping clean up an old marina.

I have kept all the boats for the last 15 years at DYC and would never leave.

Desert Dweller Becomes A Boater by Doyle M.

I was born and raised in Phoenix, Arizona. My family and I are desert dwellers; no boating experience at all.

After graduating from ASU, my wife and I planned to migrate north to Alaska; and thought it would be fun to have a small boat for exploring the lakes we expected to visit along our route.

So, we bought a like new 14'Zodiac with a 20hp motor. We named our boat the "Armstead Smith".



Why that name? The original owner of the boat had written his name on every piece of the inflatable and its gear in big indelible black ink letters. The name stuck.

Finally, it is time to take our boat out for its inaugural run. We inflated the boat, attached the launch wheels, hung the Merc on the transom, loaded her up and backed her into the water.

The motor started right up and soon we were idling out of the no wake zone. When we cleared the buoy, I cranked her wide open. "Armstead" gained a bit of speed but not much.

I expected to be flying with that 20 hp; what the..., had I bought a lemon?

I looked it all over, checked the fuel tank-everything looked good, the engine ran fine but the boat wouldn't go above no-wake speed. To say I was frustrated is an understatement. There was a bit of cussing.

It was hot, my wife Christy was tired of my frustrated grumbling and jumped in the lake to cool off.

She swam a couple of laps around the boat, and then from the water shouted, "the launch wheels are still down!"

In the down position the launch wheels hung more than a foot below the bottom of the boat, causing a huge drag; and were close to impossible to see from inside the boat.

In an instant, I removed and reset the transom mounted launch wheels to the "up" position. We fired up, hit the throttle and rocketed across Lake Pleasant.

Our first boating lesson- "Wheels Up". 1



Reminders for Boat Storage


- 1. Keep Your Boat Locked. Be sure DYC Service has a copy of your keys.
- 2. Set up Monthly Boat Check by DYC Service or come check on your boat monthly.
- 3. No Onboard Heat Sources unless you are Onboard during their usage.
- 4. Winterize Your Boat Systems or have DYC Winterize for you.
- 5. Safely Secure all canvas, sails, lines and personal items on deck.
- 6. Schedule your Haul & Relaunch ahead of time to meet your needs.
- 7. Call or visit DYC Office to Sign in for overnight stays onboard during boat storage.
- 8. Winter power outages are unpredictable-empty refrigerator to avoid odors. ↓
